







COVID Home Learning Protocol (Parents and Teachers) 2021-2022

All pupils not physically unwell should have access to remote education as soon as is reasonably practicable.

Parents will:	School will:
 On the first day of isolation parents will: Ensure that you can provide the opportunity for your child/children to work in a quiet, dedicated area and have access to video lessons at home (desk-tops, laptops/tablets are ideal). If there is an issue with providing these, please contact the school – we will endeavour to help. From the second day of isolation/home schooling onwards: Ensure children complete the work set by the school. Ensure work is uploaded to your child's Dojo portfolio Phone school in the usual way if your child is physically unwell and unable to participate in the daily learning. Ensure that all work relating to the day's sessions is uploaded to your child's individual portfolio by 5.00pm. 	 On the first day of isolation the class teacher will: Revise and update their planning to ensure lessons are suitable to be accessed from home. Send an overview home outlining the work for the isolation period. Send home an overview of the next day's work. From the second day of isolation/home schooling onwards: Teachers will set work for maths and English each day. One area of wider curriculum learning will be set each day in addition to Maths and English. The maths input may be supported with Oak Academy video lessons and will be linked to the learning being undertaken in class. English learning will continue to follow our Talk for writing approach. If there are worksheets or items to be downloaded they will be posted on the Class Dojo portfolio or class story page. Class teachers will give a general comment for the work uploaded and will use the work to inform their teacher assessment

We understand that some families will have difficulties supporting their child in their home learning due to other commitments such as their own work schedules or caring for younger siblings, but by law we must provide education for those who aren't at school due to COVID. Your employer should be accommodating to your circumstances. Please do contact us if you are having any difficulties with supporting your child during this time.
